225 students are attending our classes— from preschool till 9th grade.

We want our students to be responsible, open-minded, independent and caring individuals.

We are not religious or politically founded.

Organization

Hundige Lille Skole is a private school. In Denmark, this means that we get a grant from the Danish state, and that parents, who wants their children to attend our school, has to pay a monthly school fee.

Timetable and subjects...

The school starts every day at 8.30 am. The day ends at 1.45 pm for our students in preschool - 3rd grade / at 3 pm for our students in 4th grade - 6th grade / and 3 pm for the students in our 7th grade —9th grade.

We teach:

Danish (literature, cultural history and grammar), English, German, Mathematics, Physics, Biology, Geography, Social Studies, History, Religion, Art, Drama, Music, Woodwork and Physical Education.

School camp and exchange...

Our students are going on a school camp or do a foreign exchange every year during their time at Hundige Lille Skole.

1st - 6th grade: Our students attend a 5 day school camp in Denmark.

7th grade: Do an exchange with a school in Denmark. We visit them for a week in autumn, and they visit our school the following spring.

8th grade: Do an exchange with a Danish school located in Northern Germany. We visit

them for a week in autumn, and they visit our school the following spring.

9th grade: Do an exchange with Hungary. We visit them for a week in autumn, and they visit our school the following spring.

School values...

We want our students to learn that they are a part of this world.

We want them to be responsible young people and teach them about different cultures.

We don't just want our students to see themselves only as Europeans, but as "World Citizens".

We want them to be tolerant, to accept and acknowledge the world and the people surrounding them.

We hope to teach them this by visiting other cultures/ countries and by inviting other cultures/ countries to visit us.

When we travel with our students, we prefer to stay in private homes instead of hotels. This way our students get closer to the people and the cultures we visit.
